Christ the King Discipleship Pathway

What is the Discipleship Pathway?

The Discipleship Pathway is a tool to help you grow in your faith and your relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. The sections of the image above represent the different elements of our lives as a disciple of Christ: Worship, Encounter, Grow, and Serve. The idea is not that each parishioner would be involved in every single element of this pathway all the time, but that you would discern what God wants you to participate in, given your current circumstances.

Here are some Frequently Asked Questions and answers about the Discipleship Pathway:

1. As a parishioner, how do I and my family fit into the Discipleship Pathway?

Good question! You can fit into any spot that works for you and your family. If attending or serving at Alpha isn't in the cards right now, consider joining a Discipleship Group or serving at Sunday Mass. If you have children, enroll them in religious education classes or encourage them to attend A1:8.

2. Do I have to do things in a particular order?

No! Discipleship is not a linear process; it is a continual work in progress. The Holy Spirit works in our lives in ways that are unique and individual, and what God is asking us to do with our time often changes with the circumstances of our lives. So, pray about where God might want you to start and explore the different options that are available to you.

3. How was this Pathway developed?

It was developed through focus groups that we held with parishioners from 2018 to 2019 and through discussions with the leaders of ministries at Christ the King. The Directors and the Senior Leadership Team took all the feedback that we received and used that to develop the Discipleship Pathway.

4. Can a friend of mine who is not Catholic participate in the Discipleship Pathway?

Yes! All are welcome to join in any aspect of the pathway where they feel comfortable. While we recommend that those who are just learning about the faith start with Alpha, they should feel free to jump in at any point that appeals to them.



Worship

The core of our lives as disciples is the worship that we give to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Therefore, worship is the foundation for the rest of the Discipleship Pathway.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

At Christ the King, we engage in worship in many ways. First and foremost is our participation in the Holy Mass. As a Charismatic Personal Parish of the Diocese of Lansing, we have permission from our bishop to pray at particular moments in the Holy Mass with expressive or charismatic prayer. People are free to raise their hands in prayer and during songs. Many pray their own prayers audibly, some pray in tongues, etc.

A1:8 Youth Ministry (High School)

Our youth ministry staff along with a dedicated group of adult volunteers provides opportunities for high school-age teens to connect with God and with each other in small groups, large groups, on retreats, and at the Steubenville Youth Conference. They also have weekly opportunities for praise and worship, faith formation, and more. Our program for high school students meets on Tuesday evenings, 7:15-9:30 p.m., year-round. Fuel/Confirmation (Optional for 6th Grade, Required for Grades 7-8)

Confirmation preparation at Christ the King is a two-year program, with Confirmation taking place near the end of the eighth grade. Classes meet on two Sundays a month, 7:00-9:00 p.m., during the school year (Sept.-April). This program is led by trained catechists, parent volunteers, the Fuel Team (high school leaders), and our music leaders. Catechesis (Religious Education) for Grades 1-6

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS or Atrium)

A Montessori-based religious education program for 3 to 12-year-olds. Classes meet on weekday mornings and afternoons.

Vacation Bible School

A weeklong program is offered in the summer for 1st through 5th graders. Vacation Bible School at Christ the King focuses on teaching children to grow in virtue through the in-depth study and prayer of the Scripture verses for the week. Serve

Intentional disciples seek not only to encounter the Lord Jesus, worship the Trinity, and grow in their knowledge of and relationship with Them, but also to serve the mission of the Church. Below are some of the many ways that you can serve that mission at Christ the King:

Music Ministry

Christ the King's vision is to have a music ministry comprised of musicians called by the Father, surrendered to Jesus Christ, serving in the Holy Spirit, who lead people to glorify God at Christ the King and in the larger Church. Weekend Music Teams

Teams include singers and instrumentalists for Weekend Masses, made from individuals, high school age and older, who sing and/or play music well. Experience is preferred but not required. Usual duties include singing/playing at two weekends per month plus periodic team rehearsals and personal practice. There will be an interview/audition with Kelley Burns before being invited to join.

High School Music Team

This team includes singers and instrumentalists for high school prayer meetings, retreats, and other A1:8 Youth Discipleship events. This team is made up of high school age and older who sing and play music well. The commitment is every one to three weeks at the Tuesday evening prayer meeting; 2-3 hours per week plus practice time.

Adult Choir

The choir sings for special Masses on the Solemnity of Christ the King, Christmas Eve, Holy Thursday, and Easter Sunday. Qualifications include high school age or older, willingness to practice at home, ability to sing in tune, blend, learn music well, and attend rehearsals. The ability to read music is a plus. There will be an interview and audition with Kelley Burns prior to the first rehearsal. Rehearsals take place on Thursday/Monday evenings.

King's Choir (Children's Choir)

For students third through eighth grade. High school students and adults needed to assist the music director in a variety of ways, including accompanying at rehearsals, and other duties. King's Choir sings on Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday, and rehearses in the afternoons in the months prior.

Upper Room Worship Leader/Team

Teams include singers and instrumentalists for Upper Room prayer meetings on the second and fourth Fridays of the month. Individuals, high school age and older, who sing and/or play music well are welcome. Experience is preferred but not required. Ability to learn music quickly, harmonize, blend, and sing from chord charts are all preferred.

Creative (Media) Ministry Team

The Creative Ministry Team provides media support for the weekend and Holy Day Masses, Upper Room, and other parish events. Training provided. If you are interested in serving in any of the following ministries, please contact the Tech Coordinator Doug Helderop (dhelderop@ctkcc.net).

Sound Ministry

Support live sound at parish events, both in-house and for livestream events.

Video Ministry

Video, audio, and graphics support for live events and post-production. Includes lighting operators, camera operators, and graphic artists.

Support live webcasts and maintain online video libraries. Includes digital ushers, lyrics posters, on-air hosts, directors, and producers.

Assist at Mass. Youth servers must have made their First Communion. Adult servers must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Ushers

Assist with Communion, collection, and other tasks as assigned.

In 1981, Catholics in the Word of God ecumenical charismatic community started meeting weekly for Mass and reception of the sacraments with the blessing of the Bishop of Lansing, Bishop Kenneth Povish. In 1986, Bishop Povish established us as a Lay Association of the Faithful and we were given the name Christ the King Catholic Association. In 1991, we began the process of becoming a personal parish of the Diocese of Lansing, a process that was completed in 1997. We rented various facilities in the area until we dedicated our current church building in June 2001.

Today, many people come to Christ the King Catholic Church with a variety of spiritual experiences. The parish continues to provide formation and pastoral care of all persons, leading them closer to God, especially God the Holy Spirit.
